Dr. Caroline Mulinya is a highly qualified individual with a PhD in Climatology (Geography) from Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology (2017). She also holds a Masters of Arts in Geography (Climatology) from the University of Nairobi (2006) and a B.Ed (Arts) in Geography from Moi University (1999). Currently, she serves as the Director of Centre of Climate Action and Research (CECARE and Senior Lecturer of Geography (Climatology and Climate Change Sciences). In the past, she was Director of University Linkages and Career Services. She chaired the Geography Department at Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology and served as the Examination Coordinator for the Department of Geography. Additionally, she has been a Zone Coordinator in charge of School Practice in Busia and Butere Zones.

Dr. Mulinya has previously worked as a Research Scientist for Kenya Industrial and Development Institute (KIRDI), Research Assistant for IUCN and GEF, and Consultant for IGAD (Intergovernmental Authority on Development). She has also taught Geography at the high school level in several schools in Kenya.

Dr. Mulinya is a researcher who has been involved in various research projects.
