Kakamega County, Kenya - A groundbreaking study has revealed that providing glasses to students with untreated vision problems dramatically improved their everyday lives. A team of researchers from Kenya and South Africa have shown the transformative power of corrective eyewear on quality of life for school-age children.

The study, carried out on randomly selected high school students in Kakamega County, Kenya underscored the challenges faced by children with uncorrected vision issues. Such obstacles significantly impacted the quality of life for the young students. Fortunately, this study provided a glimmer of hope.


When these students were provided with corrective glasses, they experienced remarkable improvements in their day-to-day lives. The simple act of providing eyeglasses led to better quality of life scores when compared to students with normal vision.

According to Dr Okenwa-Vincent, lead author of this study, "Our research underlines the urgent need to address vision problems among children." Dr Okenwa-Vincent further said, "Providing glasses to kids in need is not just about improving vision, it's also about significantly enhancing their quality of life. We hope our findings can spur public health strategies and intervention programs in schools to ensure that children who need glasses can get them."

This research underscores the importance of early detection and correction of vision issues in school-aged children.

Okenwa-Vincent, added, "It demonstrates the positive difference we can make in young lives by advocating for the importance of corrective eyewear, especially in middle income countries. Kenya is a middle-income country that plans to be a newly industrialized nation by 2030. Youth are our most important natural resource." concluded the lead researcher.
